FLOODING AND PRELIMINARY DESIGN STUDY**

NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE NO. 2

THE STUDY

The Town of LaSalle, through their consultant Stantec Consulting Ltd., has initiated a study to investigate the cause and solutions to basement flooding resulting from rainfall events that occurred in August of 2014 and July of 2015. The study will also include a preliminary design of the Oliver Farms area, including road reconstruction, new sidewalks, watermain replacement, storm sewer replacement and evaluation of existing street lighting to meet current Town Standards. The study is being undertaken as a Schedule A+ project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.

THE PROCESS

We need your help. Two Public Information Centres (PIC) have been planned to solicit feedback from the public on initial findings of the study and potential solutions. We received very helpful and informative feedback in PIC No. 1 and hope that the upcoming PIC No. 2 proves to be equally beneficial. Your participation will form an integral part of this study to ensure that your concerns, and those of affected residents within the study area, are identified, documented and assessed.
