

LaSalle's Howard Bouffard Drainage Project Receives \$22M Boost

On Tuesday, September 9, at the LaSalle Civic Centre, Minister of Infrastructure Honourable Kinga Surma and Essex MPP Anthony Leardi, announced the Ontario government is investing \$22,424,688 in Town of LaSalle stormwater infrastructure to allow the land to be unlocked for the long-term development of approximately 10,000 new homes in the Howard Bouffard area.

The grant will provide needed funding for LaSalle's Howard Bouffard Master Drainage Solution (HBMDS). This will help eliminate flooding areas and provide adequate storm outlets to allow the Howard Bouffard Secondary Plan (HBSP) to develop. The HBMDS is required to address existing flooding in the Howard Bouffard area during major storm events, and to accommodate future development in the area. Properties in these areas are currently unable to be developed. The drainage solution consists of a main drain, a series of branch drains, and a retention pond to capture the "spill over"



from Cahill Drain. Project engineering is underway, and construction is expected to start sometime in 2027 with completion scheduled in 2029.

"It involves over 1,000 property owners and will likely take 20-years or more to fully develop. It's about complete community-building — homes, businesses, jobs, and services. It means creating opportunities for families to live, work, and thrive right here in LaSalle," said Mayor Crystal Meloche. "It is the biggest growth we'll see in the Town."

The funding is being delivered through the province's Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund (HEWSF), a stream of the Municipal Housing Infrastructure Program (MHIP). The MHIP is part of the government's plan to protect Ontario and includes historic investments in housing- and community-enabling infrastructure that will help municipalities deliver the core infrastructure needed, such as roads and water systems, to lay the foundation for new homes in communities across the province.
