General admission begins on Thursday, January 25, and is open every Thursday to Sunday until April 6,

2024. The exhibit includes entertainment, interaction, a snack stand, and more. Tickets are \$13 plus tax, ages 3 & up, and can be purchased online now and at the Event Centre when the exhibit is open.

Pedestrian Bridge

The pedestrian bridge between Vince Marcotte and Stanton Park was recently inspected and is safe to use under normal conditions. As a precaution, during extreme weather events that include heavy snow and wind, the bridge may be closed. You may have noticed that signage has recently been installed. The Town will share messaging on social media if the bridge is temporarily closed. Repairs to the bridge are planned to take place this year.

- Clearing sidewalks adjoining your property.
