Louise Martens has been selected to be an Auxiliary Sergeant. She arrives with more than 11 years' experience as an auxiliary member with the Chatham-Kent Police Service. I am confident she will be a leader in our program and our team at LPS.

Auxiliary training has included report writing, notebook use, radio communications, workplace harassment, ethics, federal and provincial statutes, traffic direction, arrest authorities, use of force theory and defensive tactics techniques, missing person searches, police vehicle operations, and firearms safety and handling.

These auxiliary members will assist with community engagement, crime prevention initiatives, community events, searches for missing persons, and ride-along with officers.

(Auxiliary candidates will swear to an oath of office. Oaths of secrecy were conducted at their first training date).

Subject: 2025 IPC Statistics

Background:

Each year, the LaSalle Police Service reports statistics to the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario.

In 2024, we received 37 Freedom of Information requests. We responded to all requests within 30 days, achieving 100% compliance.

In 2025, we received 54 Freedom of Information requests plus four that were withdrawn and not being counted below. This equals a 46% increase over 2024. We responded to 31 requests within 30 days, 14 requests between 31-60 days, 1 request within 61-90 days, and 7 requests more than 90 days. This equates to a 57% compliance rate. Reasons for the delay in completion are:

- 46% increase in FOI workload
- A Records Clerk being absent for a few months for medical reasons
- A new Records Clerk joined the organization around the same time and was completing onboarding training and learning other duties.

This result illustrates that when Records Clerks are absent, work builds without adequate capacity for redundancy in tasks. We are currently evaluating the workload of our Records Clerks to understand demand, and where to capture efficiencies.

Subject: Conducted Energy Weapons Modernization

Background:

The LaSalle Police Service has been using conducted energy weapons called Taser X2 made by Axon for about a decade. In 2023, Axon discontinued manufacturing, servicing, and supporting the X2 model. As most police services in Ontario transitioned to the newer Taser 7 model (and more recently to the Taser 10 model), we sought their used X2 models and accessories to delay costs.

The need for conducted energy weapon modernization was recognized in 2024 and included in the 2025-2028 LPS Strategic Plan. It was considered last year as part of preparations for the 2026 budget, but we elected to delay requesting funds to reduce the 2026 budget request. By the end of this year, (three years after their discontinuation), we can no longer continue using the X2 model, and modernizing our CEW's is unavoidable.

As a result, we had planned to include purchasing Taser 10 models in the 2027 budget. We have since learned that the Peel Regional Police transitioned from Taser 7 to Taser 10 last year. They have graciously agreed to donate 50 Taser 7's and holsters for free. The cost savings are \$183,450. We will need to purchase batteries and cartridges at a cost of \$41,000 plus HST. We will delay this purchase until January 2027 with transition training to occur in February 2027.
